Four persons die in a mishap

Warangal: Four persons were killed in a mishap after a speeding lorry hit a car coming in the opposite direction near Devarupula police station in Jangaon district on Thursday. Two persons died on the spot and two others succumbed to their injuries while undergoing treatment at hospital. According to the police, P Ganesh and his wife P Manjusha of Mahabubabad, left for Shamshabad airport on Wednesday to drop off their son who is going to London. Their relatives Srilatha and Sukanya accompanied them. While Ganesh and Sukanya died on the spot, the driver Nazeer and Srilatha succumbed to their injuries at the MGM hospital in Warangal. Manjusha is still fighting for life.

BHADRADRI POWER UNIT 1 IS READY

Bhadradri Power Project, which is set up in Manuguru, crossed a milestone on Thursday. The synchronisation of the first unit with a capacity of 270 MW in the BPP experiments that were done for the last three months made the synchronisation a total success. Bhadradi Power Project is the first power project that was taken up by Telangana Genco after the formation of Telangana. Chief Minister K. Chandrasekhar Rao laid the foundation stone for the project on March 28, 2015. The government allocated ₹8,500 crore for the 270 MWx4 units power capacity unit and Genco managing director Devulapalli Prabhakara Rao focused on the project and constantly interacted with the engineers. The Bhadradi Power Project faced hiccups in the form of a case in the National Green Tribunal on the allegation that the project was being built by using sub-critical technology. As a result, the works were halted for 17 months. The rains also caused a delay for five months. As per the details, the first boiler erection works started on March 11, 2017 and the hydraulic test was conducted to the Boiler drum on August 17, 2018. Turbo generator excavator works began on September 7, 2019 and boiler light up was done on March 25, 2019. The commercial operation date will be in October.

KCR to meet Modi soon

This would be the 1st meet between PM, CM in 2nd term

After West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee meet with the Prime Minister Narendra Modi, it is now Chief Minister Mr K. Chandrasekhar Rao's turn to do so. Sources said that after the ongoing Assembly budget session Mr Rao is likely to meet Mr Modi. Since Mr Modi become Prime Minister and KCR CM, both for the second time, they have not met. In fact, Mr Rao sought an appointment with Mr Modi in the past but was not given a date due to Mr Modi's busy schedule. West Bengal CM Mamata Banerjee is much stronger critic of Mr Modi than Mr Rao. Despite that, Mr Modi gave an appointment to Ms. Banerjee and she met him on Wednesday. TRS senior leaders said after that meeting, Mr Modi may give appointment to

Mr Rao next. TRS leaders are expecting this meeting to take place after the Assembly session. Union home minister Amit Shah skipped the Telangana Liberation Day function conducted by Telangana BJP on 17 September at Kukatpally. TRS leaders said this has given relief to them as if Amit Shah had attended the function, he would have been made some remarks against the TRS government and they would have been forced to react to those comments. This would have widened the gap between the BJP national leadership and the TRS further. If Mr Modi gives an appointment to Mr Rao, the latter will bring all pending issues related to the bifurcation and financial issues to him. Mr Rao will also discuss the effect of economic recession on Telangana state and will seek more funds from the Centre.

KCR, JAGAN TO DISCUSS RIVER WATER SHARING ON SEPT. 24

The Chief Ministers of the two Telugu states - Telangana and Andhra Pradesh - K. Chandrasekhar Rao and Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy respectively, would meet on September 24 in Hyderabad to discuss the sharing of Godavari waters, diverting it to the Krishna basin and other pending issues of the bifurcation. Both Chief Ministers had met twice earlier, on June 28 and on August 1, to hold preliminary discussions on the sharing of the Godavari waters. They had agreed, in principle, to take up the

required lift irrigation project jointly. A joint committee of the irrigation engineers of the two states was constituted to examine the feasibility of diverting the Godavari waters to the Srishailam and Nagarjuna Sagar reservoirs on Krishna river, and then share them between the two states according to their drinking and irrigation needs. Sources in the TS government disclosed that the engineers committee had prepared reports on the project. Both the CMs, during their meeting on September 24, would discuss the report and work out a road map for sharing waters.

KCR SEEKS PLAN FOR NIZAMABAD WATER NEEDS

Chief Minister K. Chandrasekhar Rao on Thursday directed irrigation officials to prepare a comprehensive plan for supplying water to the erstwhile Nizamabad district for drinking and irrigation purposes. The Chief Minister issued this order after legislators from the combined Nizamabad district met him in the chambers of Legislative Assembly Speaker P. Srinivas Reddy in the Assembly. KCR said, "Since there is less availability of water in Nizam Sagar and Singur dams this year, villages under the jurisdiction of these projects will have to be supplied water through alternative methods." He ordered officials to prepare alternative / temporary plans for the purpose.

Harish Rao, Jagga meet after 14 years

They both belong to the same district; the two were elected as MLAs in the recent assembly elections from different political parties. Both were in the same party in the past, but they turned severe critics of each other. And, after 14 years, both met in the assembly lobbies on Thursday to everybody's surprise. The two are Congress MLA T. Harish Rao. Jaggareddy said he had discussed development of his Sangareddy constituency.

Incidentally, when the two met in the assembly lobbies, their meeting went on for about 30 minutes. Both belong to the old Medal district. Jagga Reddy was in TRS for some time in the past. During the recent assembly elections and also later the Congress MLA had made serious allegations against Harish Rao. In this backdrop, the two meeting left MLAs and political circles surprised. After the meeting, Jagga Reddy said he had discussed development of his Sangareddy constituency.

KCR lauds SCCL workers

Chief Minister Mr. K Chandrasekhar Rao on Thursday announced a bonus of ₹1,00,899 to each worker of the Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL), a public sector undertaking. While making a statement in the Assembly, Mr. Rao said that this is a bonus given by the state government to the SCCL workers and employees as a Dasara festival gift. He said that in the development of Telangana, the SCCL is playing a very crucial role and that the SCCL has been strengthened institutionally due to the cooperation extended by the state government and measures taken for the welfare of the workers. He said "It is a proud moment for all of us when the SCCL fared

better than Coal India in almost all parameters related to coal management in the country." He said that the state government is of the firm opinion that the key role played by workers, often keeping their lives at stake, is important in the SCCL's continuous victory and success. Mr. Rao added, "Our government feels that the sweat and blood that each and every SCCL worker shed in creating the national wealth, often coming out of jaws of death, is no way inferior to the sacrifices of our own army personnel fighting at the borders." Mr. Rao explained that in the financial year 2013-14, the SCCL was able to produce 50.47 million tonnes of coal and for the last five years, the production of coal has been on the increase every year.

BJP CHIEF CRITICISES CM FOR SINGARENI WORKERS

The BJP state president Dr. K Laxmana on Thursday once again hit out hard at Chief Minister Mr. Rao for not fulfilling his promises made to the Singareni workers before elections. Dr. K Laxman said, "KCR has failed to fulfill the promises he had made to the Singareni workers. KCR had promised better health facilities but did not even sanction a single super speciality hospital and whatever hospitals are available in the region doesn't have doctors, nurses and medicines to look after the patients." Dr. Laxman added Singareni Collieries covers twenty five assembly and three parliamentary constituencies. The chief minister has cheated the Singareni Collieries employees.

Infighting intensifies in Cong. over Huzurnagar Revanth effigy burnt

The controversy within Congress over the candidate to be fielded in the Huzurnagar assembly by-poll has turned bitter with some youth Congress workers burning an effigy of MP A. Revanth Reddy in the constituency. Congress MP Komatireddy Venkata Reddy also commented adversely against Revanth's statement. Three days ago, TPCC President N. Uttam Kumar Reddy had announced that his wife Padmavathi will be contesting the by-election from Huzurnagar assembly constituency, the seat the state Congress chief vacated following his election as an MP in the Lok Sabha polls. Taking objection to this, TPCC Working President and MP Revanth Reddy maintained that he would instead be proposing the candidature of Chamala Kiran Kumar Reddy, TPCC Spokesperson.

Opposing the comments of Revanth Reddy, Youth Congress workers of Huzurnagar burnt an effigy of the MP in the constituency on Thursday. Bhongir Congress MP Komatireddy Venkata Reddy also objected to the Malkajgiri MP dabbling into the candidature issue as the latter was a non-local. Speaking to media in the assembly lobbies, Komatireddy said: "We have senior leaders like Uttam Kumar Reddy, K Jana Reddy, Damodar Reddy and others; we don't need involvement of leaders from other districts." Venkat Reddy asserted that Padmavathi will be a strong candidate and is sure to win the Huzurnagar assembly by-poll. He maintained that Uttam Kumar, Jana Reddy and he himself have been in politics of Nalgonda district since last 30 years. "How can anybody propose a new candidate without consulting us," the Bhongir MP asked.

TRS IS CONFIDENT OF WINNING HUZURNAGAR

Energy minister G. Jagadish Reddy on Thursday exuded confidence that TRS will win the ensuing by-election from Huzurnagar Assembly constituency, from where K. Chatting with reporters in the Assembly lobbies, the minister brushed aside allegations of TPCC that the ruling TRS has been harassing Congress workers in the Huzurnagar constituency. The ruling party pointed out that not a single case has been booked against any of the Congress workers.
